## Grading of Certificates (Major, Special Purpose and Supplemental Awards - Level 4 to 6 FE\&T)

## Context

The grading classification of Pass, Merit and Distinction will apply to all award types within the Common Awards System at levels 4-6.

In addition to component grades being displayed on component certificates and transcripts, the grade for major, special purpose and supplemental awards will be printed on the certificate parchments.

## Grading Algorithm

- The grade for the award ${ }^{1}$ is calculated on the basis of the weighted average of the grades achieved in the components used to achieve the award.
- The credit value for each component determines the relative weighting of that component in the context of the award.
- The grade achieved by the learner for each component is Pass, Merit, or Distinction. A component can also be achieved by exemption if being combined with assessed components to achieve a major award.
- For the purpose of calculating the weighted average a numerical value is applied to each of the grade classifications, as follows: Pass (1), Merit (2), Distinction (3). For a component gained by exemption a value of 1 is applied i.e. it is treated as if a Pass.
- The weighted average is calculated by the sum of the products of each component's credit value (CV) and grade value (GV) divided by the total credit value of the award. See below.
- The following additional rules will apply in calculating the weighted average grade,
i. The weighted average will be calculated to two decimal places and then rounded to the nearest whole number i.e.
a. Averages of 1.50 and 2.50 upwards are interpreted as Merit or Distinction respectively.
b. Averages of 1.49 and 2.49 downwards are interpreted as Pass or Merit respectively.
ii. $\quad$ The whole number is translated back to the appropriate grade for the award i.e. $1=$ Pass, $2=$ Merit, 3 = Distinction.
Award Grade $=\frac{(C V 1 \times \text { GV1 })+(C V 2 \times \text { GV2 })+(\ldots . . C V n \times \text { GVn })}{\text { Total Credit Value }}$
